He has developed advanced skills in creative writing, including historical narratives, theatrical scripts, comic books and novels. He is also an expert in the History of Comics and copyrighting. He is a Bronze Age specialist with a focus on Minoan-Mycenaean culture.

Senior advisor in Projects Development, Project and Knowledge Management for several Italian SMEs and no profit organizations, in the last 15 years Corrado has worked at international level, carrying out multi-annual projects financed by the European Commission, in the fields of ICT innovation, education and training, social affairs, the promotion of SMEs and local authorities, promoting international cooperation aimed at community development.

He provided teaching at the University of Pavia, Faculty of Economics, teaching EU policies for development, financial growth and strategy for development (including EC-based financed programmes) at the chair of *Progetto Europa*.

At present, he cooperates with an European and Extra-European international network of nearly 300 entities, in the 27 member states of the European Union, Russia, Israel, India, USA, Canada, Nicaragua, China and Nepal.

He has designed, developed and carried out training courses for local authorities in New Members States (cf. 2004 Enlargement phase) under the Memorandum of Understanding between Italy, Poland, Romania and Malta, promoted by CIDE (Centro Nazionale di Informazione e Documentazione Europea). At National level he carried out project to evaluate the national education system, promoted by Invalsi (Istituto Nazionale per la Valutazione del Sistema Educativo di Istruzione e di Formazione) and developed knowledge management models supporting social security and improving public social services, under the supervision of the Italian Ministry of Justice and the Presidenza del Consiglio dei Ministri (Presidency of the Cabinet of Ministries).

He has cooperated with the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and IOM (International Organisation for Migrations), to improve the quality of Tertiary Education in Romania.

At present, he has over 60 projects approved to financing on several national and European Commission programmes.
